
Retirement Announcement

Alumni Spotlight

Craig Duehring's journey from Loyola Catholic School to becoming a decorated Air Force pilot is a testament to the skills and desire for knowledge he honed as a student. A graduate of the Class of 1963, he remembers spending much time in Loyola's library, thumbing through books and learning about the world he would one day explore from the sky. His aviation dreams took flight when he experienced his first airplane ride at Mankato Airport, igniting a passion that led him to join the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) and excel as the senior-ranking cadet in our state.

Upon graduating from college, Duehring embarked on a remarkable career in the USAF, earning his officer's commission and



undergoing rigorous training. His deployment to Southeast Asia marked the beginning of a heroic chapter, where he served as a forward air controller during the Vietnam War. Throughout two tours, including one in Laos as a 'Raven,' Duehring demonstrated unparalleled courage, logging 1525 combat hours across 834 missions. His valor earned him two Distinguished Flying Crosses (DFCs) and the prestigious Silver Star Medal, recognizing his extraordinary contributions in the face of adversity. Additionally, he was awarded 27 Air Medals for his exceptional aerial achievements. He writes of these experiences in his wartime autobiography, <u>"The Lair of Raven"</u>.

Transitioning from combat roles, Duehring continued to excel, serving as a jet instructor and contributing significantly to NATO's operations in Europe. His ascent within the Air Force culminated in his appointment as Assistant Secretary of the Air Force, where he oversaw the well-being and operations of all Air Force personnel, including active duty, Reserve, and Guard members. This pivotal role tasked him with coordinating assignments, training programs, housing initiatives, and medical facilities, ensuring the readiness and welfare of the entire Air Force community. One of his greatest achievements occurred in 1987 when Duehring's exemplary leadership earned him the Lance P. Sijan Award, presented by the Chief of Staff of the Air Force and the Secretary of the Air Force. This prestigious award is given to the top leader in the entire USAF in the Senior Officer Category (including all Lt Colonels, Colonels, and Brigadier Generals).

Duehring's illustrious career stands as a shining example of the extraordinary heights our alumni can reach, inspiring current and future generations to aim for excellence and make impactful contributions to our world.

To ensure Loyola teachers are equally supported, Hardy launched the fund and made the first donation in 2005. He firmly believed that the most important instrument in the classroom is the teacher.

Hardy passed away in 2019 and is deeply missed by the Loyola community. Next to the Teacher's Competitive Compensation Fund, this is the largest endowment in support of teacher salaries held at the Schola Foundation.


